Master the Future!

WILL

Will is used for quick decisions made at the moment of speaking. For example:

I'm thirsty! I think I **will** buy a drink.
It's hot in here. **I'll** turn on the air conditioner.

Will can also be used when you are making an offer. For example:

I **will** help you with your luggage. It looks heavy!
I'll get a coffee for you.

GOING TO

AND PRESENT CONTINUOUS!

Going to is used for actions that have already been decided (before you speak about them). For example:

I'm **going to** take some time off work this year.
He's **going to** quit his job and become an artist.

Going to can also be used for future predictions when there is evidence that it is likely to happen.

This team is playing so poorly today. They're **going to** lose!
It's so cloudy. I think it's **going to** rain.

We can use the **present continuous** for plans or arrangements. For example:

They are **coming** to see us tomorrow.
We're **having** a party at Christmas.
