## WILL



**Will** is used for quick decisions made at the moment of speaking. For example:

I'm thirsty! I think I **will** buy a drink. It's hot in here. I'll turn on the air conditioner.

**Will** can also be used when you are making an offer. For example:

I will help you with your luggage. It looks heavy! I'll get a coffee for you.

## **GOING TO**

## AND PRESENT CONTINUOUS!

**Going to** is used for actions that have already been decided (before you speak about them). For example:

I'm **going to** take some time off work this year. He's **going to** quit his job and become an artist.

**Going to** can also be used for future predictions when there is evidence that it is likely to happen.

This team is playing so poorly today. They're **going to** lose! It's so cloudy. I think it's **going to** rain.

We can use the **present continuous** for plans or arrangements. For example:

They are **coming** to see us tomorrow. We're **having** a party at Christmas.
