EXAMPLES

Explaining the features and benefits

- √ The main benefit is...

Comparing services and systems

- √It's a lot more accurate/It's a lot less time-consuming because...
- √The new system will be much...
- √One of the problems is that...

Asking questions and expressing concerns

- √Will it let me/allow me to...?
- √What happens if...
- √But wouldn't that...
- √I'm not convinced that...
- √I have a question, too...

Handling questions and concerns

- √That's a good question.
- √That's true, but
- √It might seem..., but in fact...
- √I'm sure you'll find it much...





EXAMPLE DIALOGUE

Situation 1

The team leader is explaining the benefits of a new computer feature.

Jim: Hi everyone, I'm here to talk about the new software. Well, the main benefits are its time tracking and vacation time features. It's a lot more accurate because it automatically knows how many hours you worked each week. In addition, it will track your vacation time and will send you reminders to use your vacation time to ensure a good work-life balance.

Sara: What happens if I forget to log on to the system in the morning when I start work?

Jim: Thank you for your question, the system will automatically track your hours as soon as you pass through the security gate in the front entrance. Does this answer your question?

Sara: Yes, it does thank you.

Situation 2

Your friend is telling you about the features of an Android smartphone.

Hiromi: Hi Colin. What's the matter?

Colin: I can't decide on what type of phone I should buy.

Hiromi: Well, If I were you, I would buy a smartphone with an Android OS.

Colin: Why is that Hiromi?

Hiromi: The main benefit is that you don't have to use iTunes to transfer music.

Moreover, more third-party vendors develop apps for Android.

Colin: Will it let me use Facetime?

Hiromi: Unfortunately, you can't use Facetime, but you can use a variety of other

meeting apps.
