

## OCTOBER 2021 OPEN WORKSHOP MANY, MUCH OR A LOT?



We use "much" with singular uncountable nouns and in negative sentences!

- I don't have much time today.
- We didn't make much money this year.
- Is there much work left to be done?

Use "many" with plural and countable nouns!

- I've been to FAB-15 many times.
- There are many ways to improve productivity.
- I have so many tasks to finish today.

We usually use a "lot of" for positive sentences and uncountable nouns!

- There are a lot of monuments and a lot of historic buildings in Hiroshima.
- She gave me a lot of information.

2) There are too ... cars on the road. More people should use public transport.


3) Haven't they sold ... tickets?

## Hint: A lot

A lot of and lots of are used with both plural count and non-count nouns.

They are normally used in affirmative sentences.

- We met a lot of people when we went out.
- There were lots of different stalls at the market.
