Zero, First and Second Conditionals

Conditional sentences describe the result of a certain condition.

They have 2 parts:

- ***the 'if' clause which tells you the condition (e.g., If you study hard,)***
- ***the main clause which tells you the result (e.g., you will pass your exams).***

The order of the clauses can be changed without changing the meaning.

The zero, first, and second conditionals are forms of conditional sentences used to express different types of conditions and their possible outcomes.

In summary, the zero conditional expresses general truths, the first conditional expresses likely future outcomes, and the second conditional expresses hypothetical or unlikely situations.

Let's take a closer look! 

Zero Conditional



We use the **zero conditional** to talk about general truths, known facts or situations that are generally true, *where the same result is expected when a specific condition is met.*

The **zero conditional** is formed with the present simple tense in both the condition and the result clauses.

In **zero conditional** sentences, you can replace "if" with "when", because they both express general truths.

Zero Conditional - EXAMPLE SENTENCES

The structure is: if/when + present simple >> present simple.

1. If you heat water to 100 degrees Celsius, it boils. OR
Water boils if you heat it to 100 degrees Celsius.
2. If you heat ice, it melts. OR
Ice melts if you heat it.
3. When the sun goes down, it gets dark. OR
It gets dark when the sun goes down.
4. When it rains, the ground gets wet. OR
The ground gets wet when it rains.
5. If I drink too much coffee, I can't sleep at night. OR
I can't sleep at night if I drink too much coffee.



First Conditional

- The first conditional is used to talk about possible future events or situations and their likely outcomes. It refers to situations that have a realistic chance of happening.
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- The **first conditional** is formed with the present simple tense in the condition clause and the future simple tense (or an alternative future form) in the result clause.
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- It is common to add 'probably' **after** 'will' or **before** 'won't, or to replace 'will' with words such as '*might*' or '*may*' when you are less sure about an outcome.

First Conditional - EXAMPLE SENTENCES

The structure is: if/when + present simple >> will + verb.

- 1. If it rains tomorrow, we will (probably) stay indoors.**
- 2. If you don't study hard, you (probably) won't pass the exam.**
- 3. If it doesn't rain tomorrow, we might go to the beach.**
- 4. I'll call you when I get back from my business trip.**
- 5. I'll leave when I finish writing this report.**



Second Conditional

The **second conditional** is used to describe hypothetical present or future scenarios.

The **second conditional** is formed with the past simple tense in the conditional clause and the infinitive in the result clause.

When *'if'* is followed by the verb *be*, it is grammatically correct to say *"if I were"*, *"if he were"*, *"if she were"* and *"if it were"*. However, it is also common to hear these structures with *'was'*, especially in spoken English.

Second Conditional - EXAMPLE SENTENCES

The structure is usually: **if + past simple >> would + infinitive.**

- 1. If I won the lottery, I would travel the world.**
- 2. I would apologize if I were you.**
- 3. If our team had access to better data analytics tools, we would make more informed decisions.**
- 4. If she was prime minister, she would invest more money in schools.**
- 5. He would travel more if he were younger.**

A quick recap and comparison!

Zero conditional: If/When it rains, I use my umbrella. *(This is a true statement of fact)*

First conditional: If it rains later, I will use my umbrella. *(There are rain clouds in the sky, so this is highly likely)*

Second conditional: If I had an umbrella, I would use it! *(... but I don't have an umbrella!)*
