At work, we often need to explain how long a task or process took from start to finish or how long a particular situation or problem lasted.

We may also need to explain when those tasks, processes or situations started or how far back in time they occurred.

In all these cases, the words 'for', 'since' and 'ago' are very useful.

'for' is used to express a duration of time,

'since' is used to indicate a starting point in time, and

'ago' is used to refer to a past point in time.

Let's take a closer look!



#### For is used to express a period of time.

How long are you staying in London? I'm staying for a week.
My mother is going to Rome for a few days with a friend.
Hugo is going to study in Sydney for 6 months.

For is often used with the Present Perfect.

He <u>has been waiting</u> at the bus stop for 10 minutes.

I <u>have lived</u> in Hashimoto for 5 years.

I <u>have had</u> this car for a long time.

#### For can be used with other verb tenses:

Present: I go on holidays for two weeks every summer.


Past: When I was sixteen, I stayed in London for two months.


Future: While I am in the USA, I will be in New York for two days

# Some more example sentences using 'for'

For (referring to duration of time):

- 01. We have been working on this problem for three days.
- 02. The contract is valid for one year.
- 03. The training session lasted for three hours.
- 04. I have been waiting for two hours.
- 05. They lived in that house for ten years.






### 'since'

- Since' is used to indicate a specific starting point in time.
- It is used to express when an action or state began.
- The **Present Perfect** is generally used in the main clause.

- I have been working since 8 o'clock this morning.
- I live in Tokyo. I *have lived* in Tokyo *since* January 2010.

### Some more example sentences using 'since'



- 1. I have known him since we were at university.
- She has been working here since last year.
- They have been together since they met in college.
- We have been using the new software since the beginning of last month.
- We have been friends since our first day working together at Micron.



## 'ago'

- 'Ago' is used to indicate a past point in time.
- It is used to express how much time has passed before the present moment.
- The verb is in the **Past Tense**.

I came to Tokyo five years ago.


The castle was built 300 years ago.

We **heard** rumors about the merger some time **ago**.

#### Some more example sentences using 'ago'

**Ago** (relating to a past point in time):

- **01.** I **visited** Paris two years **ago**.
- **02.** She **graduated** from college three months **ago.**
- **03.** The board meeting **took place** three days **ago.**
- **04.** He quit his job six weeks ago.
- **05.** The new product was launched two months ago.

- 03. The conference will be held at the convention center \_\_\_\_\_ three days.
