**‘since’**



**‘ago’**



*At work, we often need to explain how long a task or process took from start to finish or how long a particular situation or problem lasted.*

*We may also need to explain when those tasks, processes or situations started or how far back in time they occurred.*

*In all these cases, the words ‘for’, ‘since’ and ‘ago’ are very useful.*

*‘for’ is used to express a duration of time*

*‘since’ is used to indicate a starting point in time*

*‘ago’ is used to refer to a past point in time*

Let’s take a closer look!

# 'for'

For is used to express a period of time.

*How long are you staying in London? I'm staying **for** a week.*

*My mother is going to Rome **for** a few days with a friend.*

*Hugo is going to study in Sydney **for** 6 months.*



For is often used with the Present Perfect.

*He has been waiting at the bus stop **for** 10 minutes.*

*I have lived in Hashimoto **for** 5 years.*

*I have had this car **for** a long time.*



For can be used with other verb tenses:

*Present : I go on holidays **for** two weeks every summer.*

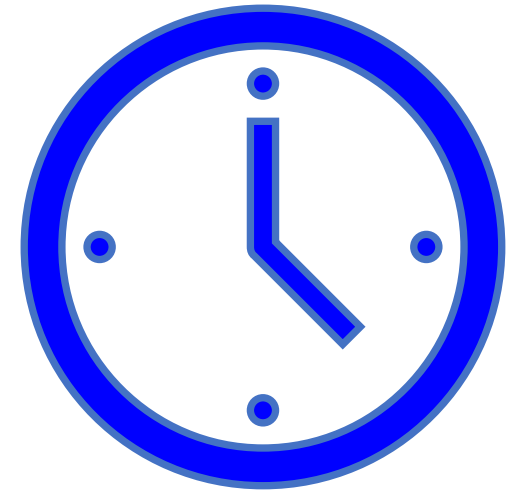
*Past : When I was sixteen, I stayed in London **for** two months.*

*Future : While I am in the USA , I will be in New York **for** two days*

# Some more example sentences using 'for'

**For** (referring to duration of time):

1. We have been working on this problem **for** three days.
2. The contract is valid **for** one year.
3. The training session lasted **for** three hours.
4. I have been waiting **for** two hours.
5. They lived in that house **for** ten years.



# 'since'

- '**Since**' is used to indicate a specific starting point in time.
- It is used to express when an action or state began.
- The **Present Perfect** is generally used with '**since**'.

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- I *have been working* **since** 8 o'clock this morning.
  - I live in Tokyo. I *have lived* in Tokyo **since** January 2010.





## Some more example sentences using 'since'

1. I have known him **since** we were at university.
2. She has been working here **since** last year.
3. They have been together **since** they met in college.
4. We have been using the new software **since** the beginning of last month.
5. We have been friends **since** our first day working together at Micron.

# 'ago'



- 'Ago' is used to indicate a past point in time.
- It is used to express how much time has passed before the present moment.
- The verb is in the **Past Tense**.

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I **came** to Tokyo five years **ago**.

The castle **was built** 300 years **ago**.

We **heard** rumors about the merger some time **ago**.



# Some more example sentences using 'ago'

**Ago** (relating to a past point in time):

1. I **visited** Paris two years **ago**.
2. She **graduated** from college three months **ago**.
3. The board meeting **took place** three days **ago**.
4. He **quit** his job six weeks **ago**.
5. The new product **was launched** two months **ago**.
